From the Rabbi's Desk



The Image of the Sukkah, One of Peace

Every evening in our prayers we say, "May God shield us in a Sukkah of peace". The thing we want most of all is a world of peace. But sadly there are hundreds of millions of others who don't. Israel is an amazing success story. Perhaps the greatest success story in the history of Earth. It leads the world in a myriad of ways from computer technology, cell phone technology, medicine, scientific papers, museums, poetry, books and symphony orchestras per capita. If you would have told Ben-Gurion sixty-two years ago when there was no Israeli defense force, (they only had 650,000 people and they were facing the regular attacks from many Arab armies) that they would get to this point today, he would have been overjoyed.

Yet there are very serious issues that continue to plague Israel. I just keep wondering that if the Arab world would leave Israel alone and let them apply all the brain power to the world's problems, how much they could help the world. It would be astonishing. Alas, they have to devote a huge amount of their resources to simply surviving. They face a myriad of issues including the Muslim brotherhood of Egypt, Hamas of Gaza, Hezbollah of Lebanon, the Syrians who were trying to build a nuclear reactor until Israel bombed it, a weak Fatah whose real intentions are unclear on the West Bank and the biggest problem of all, Iran. Iran probably already has enough material to build a nuclear weapon and it's dubious that sanctions will stop them. The United States has shown no interest in using military force to stop Iran despite Secretary Clinton saying, "A nuclear Iran will not be allowed" and President Obama saying that it's a "game changer". Now we have a former Secretary of State and National Security Advisor under Carter, Brzezinski, saying that the United States should shoot down Israeli planes if they try it. It's a very troubling world. Israel of course has developed astonishing missile defense systems thanks to the help of the United States and basically the help of Illinois congressman Mark Kirk. And yet, the dangers of a nuclear Iran are formidable. A recent article in a Hadassah magazine spoke about how it will cause a proliferation of nuclear armaments throughout the Middle East because everyone is afraid of Iran and all the Arab countries are going to want them then. It could also cause a huge spike in the price of oil. Iran doesn't even have to use their weapons to further extend their support of terrorism and havoc throughout the world. There is also always the danger of the selling or giving dirty bombs to terrorists to plant throughout the world. They have missiles now that can not only reach Israel but Europe and are developing others that could reach the United States. I recommended a book on Rosh Hashanah that I hope many of you will have the chance to read called *The Israel Test* by George Gilder. He's a non-Jew and he writes that support of Israel is a test of whether you want a free, civilized democratic world or not. Those who oppose Israel don't want that kind of world and those who support Israel do. Israel is like the canary in the coal mine for what kind of world we are going to have.

One of the interesting ancient customs of Sukkot was the sacrifice of seventy bulls during the festival. Our sages said that it was to represent the seventy different nations of the world at that time. So we offer a prayer for the welfare of the entire world. We pray for all the billions of God's children on Earth for a peaceful world and we do that through strength to lead to peace. As it says in the Psalms, "may God bless us with strength and may God bless us with peace".

9th District Congressional Candidate Joel Pollak (running against incumbent Jan Schakowsky)

Topic: Israel, Iran and the World Situation



Joel Pollak is a human rights lawyer and author from [Skokie, Illinois](#). He immigrated with his family to the U.S. from South Africa in 1977 and became a U.S. citizen in 1987. He attended [Solomon Schechter Day School](#) and [Niles North High School](#), where he graduated first in his class in 1995. He was also captain of the swimming team, president of the math team, and an [All-State Scholar-Athlete](#). BA and Law Degree from Harvard.

MA in Jewish Studies from Univ. of Cape Town. Joel also published two books while at law school: [The Kasrils Affair](#) (2008) and the recent release [Don't Tell Me Words Don't Matter: How Rhetoric Won the 2008 Presidential Election](#) (2009). He graduated in June 2009, and works for the [Hudson Institute](#) on a new human rights initiative that seeks to counter the anti-American and anti-Israel efforts of dictatorships at the United Nations. In April 2009, Joel rose to national prominence after [challenging](#) Congressman Barney Frank (D-MA), asking: "How much, if any, responsibility do *you* have for the financial crisis?" It was a question few in Washington had dared to ask. The "debate" became a YouTube and TV [sensation](#), and support for Joel poured in from around the country. After being encouraged for several months by friends in the district, Joel decided to run for Congress in September 2009.

Rabbi Porath is here as part of the annual United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism Visiting Scholar Program. Rabbi Porath is a proud and passionate Jew. Whether in presenting all of the Jewish History in one hour, speaking about his more than 175 visits to the Jews of the Soviet Union and Russia, dealing with soul-felt concerns including material intimacy, confronting loss and coping with life's transitions, bringing classical Jewish texts to life, recounting stories about his family's deep rabbinic tradition or his Aliyah to Jerusalem 25 years ago, he always speaks from the heart and inspires.

Rabbi Porath is a graduate of Brandeis University (BA), Columbia University (MA), and was ordained by the Jewish Theological Seminary of America. He has served as a Hillel and congregational rabbi in the United States before making aliyah with his family in 1984. Rabbi Porath was on the faculty of the Wexner Heritage Foundation from 1988-2003 and recently completed 15 years with the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee as a member of the senior staff of the Russian department. Rabbi Porath co-founded Hillel in the Former Soviet Union as well as Sefer: The Moscow Center for University Teaching of Jewish Civilization, the umbrella framework for Academic Judaica in the post-Soviet Union. He also established a Jerusalem based organization for helping new immigrants in Israel which was awarded a national prize from Israel's Knesset. Rabbi Porath has been at the forefront of some of the greatest Jewish causes and issues of the past 40 years. Rabbi Porath is the son and grandson of rabbis on both his father's and mother's sides, for 18 generations.

Rabbi Jonathan Ginsburg, EHNTJC, Skokie speaking on History of Conservative and Reconstructionist Judaism, received his B.A. in religion from the University of Chicago and was the valedictory orator. His Masters and Rabbinic Ordination are from the Jewish Theological Seminary where he received the award for outstanding student. He is a National Merit scholar and past USA National High School Debate Champion. He has been a Congregational Rabbi for 28 years and now serves the Ezra-Habonim, Niles Township Jewish congregation of Skokie, IL since 2004. He has been Adjunct faculty of St. Catherine College and Metropolitan University. He is one of the world's leading Jewish educators online, with 8 websites, 20 blogs, 500+ educational videos with over 2 million views. He is Creator of the Jewish Institute for Religious Training, which offers online study programs for Conversion, Para rabbi training, and a children's Hebrew/Religious school. He is past president of the Minnesota Board of Rabbis and Niles Township Clergy Association and served on the Executive Rabbinic Cabinet of State of Israel Bonds, JTS Chancellor's Cabinet and various committees of the Rabbinical Assembly.

Rabbi Peter S. Knobel, Beth Emet Synagogue, Evanston, speaking on History of Reform Judaism has been spiritual leader of Beth Emet Free Synagogue, Evanston since 1980. A graduate of Hamilton College, he was ordained by Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR) in 1969, and earned a masters in philosophy and a Ph.D. from Yale University. In addition to his congregational responsibilities, Rabbi Knobel serves in leadership roles in the Reform movement on a national level as well as being actively involved in the Chicago-area community. He is the immediate past president of the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) and served as the CCAR of Siddur Editorial Committee. He also is a member of the ARZA National Board, and chairs its Institute for Reform Zionism, and is a member of the board of trustees of both the Union for Reform Judaism and the Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion. Rabbi Knobel is past president of the Chicago Board of Rabbis and the Chicago Association of Reform Rabbis. Rabbi Knobel has taught extensively at a number of colleges. He also has authored and edited numerous articles and publications in the areas of Jewish Bioethics, Liturgy and Zionist Thought and is the editor of *Gates of the Seasons: A Guide for the Jewish New Year*.
